PSC Cold Weather Rule Takes Effect November 1

The Missouri Public Service Commission's Cold Weather Rule, designed to help customers with heat-related utility bills, begins on November 1, 2017. The rule will remain in effect through March 31, 2018. The Cold Weather Rule has been a part of the Commission's rules and regulations since 1977.

The Cold Weather Rule applies to natural gas and electric utilities under PSC jurisdiction that provide heat-related service. Municipally operated systems, cooperatives and those that provide propane delivered by truck are not under PSC jurisdiction.

The Cold Weather Rule:
~ Prohibits the disconnection of heat-related service when the temperature is predicted to drop below 32 degrees during the following 24-

hour period.

~ Provides more lenient payment terms permitting reconnection of service for natural gas and/or electric customers.

~ Allows customers to budget payments over 12 months.

~ Requires that customers be notified by mail 10 days before the date the utility intends to shut off service; an attempt be made to contact the customer within 96 hours before the shut off; an attempt be made to contact the customer right before the shut off; and that notice is left at the home when service has been shut off.

~ Requires the customer be notified of possible financial help in paying the utility bill.

~ Allows for the reconnection of service for less than the full amount owed.

A customer may register with the utility if:

~ They are 65 years of age or older;

~ Disabled to the extent that they have filed with the utility a form submitted by a medical physician attesting that their household must have natural gas or electric utility service provided in the home to maintain life or health; or

~ They have obtained a formal award letter issued from the federal government of disability benefits.

A customer, registered with the utility company as elderly or disabled, will receive additional notifications prior to a proposed discontinuance of service during the Cold Weather Rule period. They may also be eligible for additional minimum payment arrangements.

If a customer is faced

with a heat-related utility bill that cannot be paid in full, it is important to:

1) Contact the utility company.

2) State an inability to pay the bill in full.

3) Provide monthly or annual income information.

4) Make a minimum payment.

5) Enter into a payment agreement.

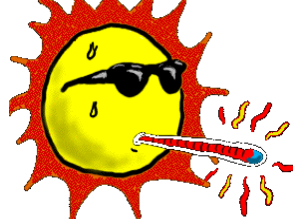

Legislature Continues to Look for Long-Term Care Funding Solution *Rep. Jim Hansen Capitol Report*

Since Veto Session in September a bipartisan group of House and Senate members have been working to find funding for Medicaid recipients who were receiving in-home care or in long-term care facilities. A funding shortfall was thought to have put some of those receiving services at risk of losing them.

House and Senate leaders arrived at several workable solutions, which included changes to the circuit breaker property tax credit. The governor's office has been made aware of the range of proposals that could restore permanent funding to this population.

However, during the process, information from the Department of Health and Senior Services has made it clear that very few Missourians are losing services at this time. According

to the department, of the 1008 participants who have been evaluated under the new level of care standard, only 30 people have had their services altered. The change was initially projected to cause more than 8,000 people to see their services reduced, but the initial round of reassessments indicates the number will be far lower.

Speaker Richardson stressed the need to include funding for healthcare providers and caregivers for this vulnerable population in the final solution.

Pro-Life Legislation Becomes Law (SB 5)

A new law takes effect this week that is meant to better ensure the health and safety of women by putting common sense safety requirements in place for abortion clinics. Approved by the legislature during a special session held in June,

the bill is also designed to protect pregnancy resource centers from a city ordinance the governor says has made St. Louis an abortion sanctuary city.

The bill that now becomes law contains several provisions to protect the health and safety of women. Some of the main provisions of the bill will:

- "Allow the attorney general to prosecute violations of state abortion laws with no obligation to first inform local prosecutors;

Require the physician who is to perform an abortion to inform the woman orally and in person of the immediate and long-term medical risks associated with the proposed method of abortion 72 hours prior to the procedure;

Allow the Department of Health and Senior Services to adopt rules governing complication plans to en-

sure patients undergoing abortions induced by drugs or chemicals have access to safe and reliable care;

Prevent abortion clinic staff from requesting emergency responders to alter their normal response procedure by turning off lights or sirens;

Require an abortion facility to provide affirmative evidence that each person authorized to perform abortions is a physician currently licensed to practice in Missouri;

Allow the state health department to adopt separate rules to apply to ambulatory surgical centers and to apply to abortion facilities;

Permit the health department to make an unannounced on-site inspection of any abortion facility at least annually;

Strengthen penalties for abortion clinics and hospitals that do not comply

with the requirements for submitting fetal tissue after an abortion; and

Require that all tissue removed at the time of abortion be sent to a pathologist within five days for examination."
