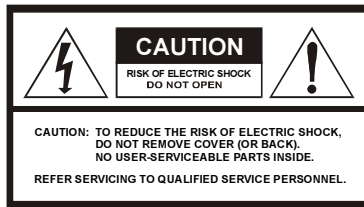

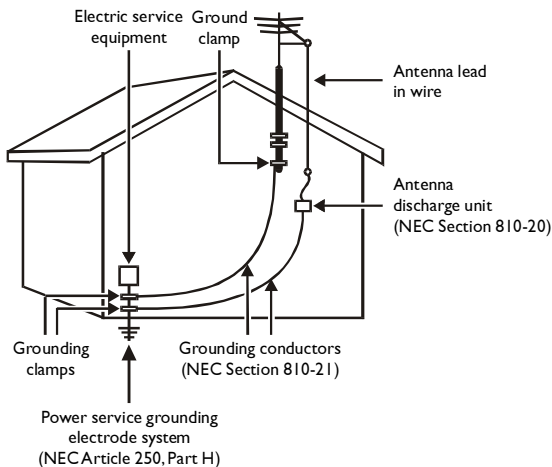

IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

1 Read instructions

14 Outdoor Antenna Grounding

For added protection for this equipment during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna or cable system. This will prevent damage to the video product due to lightning and power line surges.

16 Power lines

An outside antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or where it can fall into such power lines or circuits. When installing an outside antenna system, extreme care should be taken to keep from touching such power lines or circuits, as contact with them may be fatal.

17 Overloading

BACK PANEL



REMOTE CONTROL



The DRC 450 remote control provides basic control of the DCT5100, TV, VCR, DVD, and audio devices. For programming instructions and remote codes, refer to the DRC 450 User Guide included with your remote control.

	Key	Description
1	AUDIO, VCR/DVD, CABLE, OR TV	Selects a device to control. The selected mode will remain active until you press another key.
2	HELP	Displays the help screen.
3	POWER	Turns the currently selected device on or off.
4	PAGE ▲ PAGE ▼	Pages through menu screens and program guide.
5	EXIT	Exits a menu or program guide.
6	◀ ▲ ▶ ▼ CURSOR	Moves the cursor around the program guide and menu screens.
7	OK/SELECT	Selects menu options, VOD, Pay-Per-View events or programs from the program guide.
8	GUIDE	Displays the program guide.
9	VOLUME + VOLUME -	Increases or decreases the volume of the currently selected device.
10	A / B / C	Functionality is determined by your service provider. Not enabled on the DCT5100.
11	NUMBER KEYS	Use to directly select a channel.
12	TV/VCR BYPASS or A/B	Use to manually enable the RF bypass function. Requires a cable-ready TV to operate. (Not available on all units.)
13	STOP, PAUSE, PLAY, REW, RECORD, F.FWD	Controls the VCR, DVD, or personal video recorder (PVR).
14	MUTE	Toggles the sound on and off.
15	LOCK/PPV	Use to limit viewing of selected programs.
16	INFO	Displays the current channel and program information. (Not supported by all applications.)
17	MENU	Displays the main menu.
18	LAST	Recalls the last channel or returns to the previous menu screen.
19	CHANNEL + CHANNEL -	Changes the channels up or down.
20	FAVORITE	Displays preset favorite cable channels.
21	ENTER/MUSIC	Displays digital music channel menus. On some TV models press to enter channels.



BASIC OPERATION

Turning Power On and Off

Press **POWER** on the front panel to turn the DCT5100 on or off. When using the remote control, be sure it is in cable mode by pressing **CABLE** before pressing **POWER**.

Changing Channels

You can change channels in two ways:

- Press **CHANNEL ▲** or **▼** on the front panel of the DCT5100, or press **CHANNEL +** or **-** on the remote control to step through the channel selection.
- Enter the number of the channel you want to tune using the number keys on the remote control.

Adjusting the Volume

Press **VOLUME +** or **-** on the remote control to adjust the volume. When you adjust the volume, the volume scale is displayed on the screen.

Press **MUTE** on the remote control to turn the sound off and on again.

For best audio quality, use the remote control to set the DCT5100 to approximately $\frac{3}{4}$ of the maximum volume level and then adjust the audio levels on external devices such as your TV or A/V Receiver.

Interactive Program Guide

The interactive program guide displays information about TV programs and enables you to access features such as Parental Control or Pay-Per-View. Interactive program guides can vary with each cable service provider. Refer to the interactive program guide instruction manual for detailed instructions.

AUDIO/VIDEO CONNECTIONS

Before you begin to hook up your DCT5100, review the following:

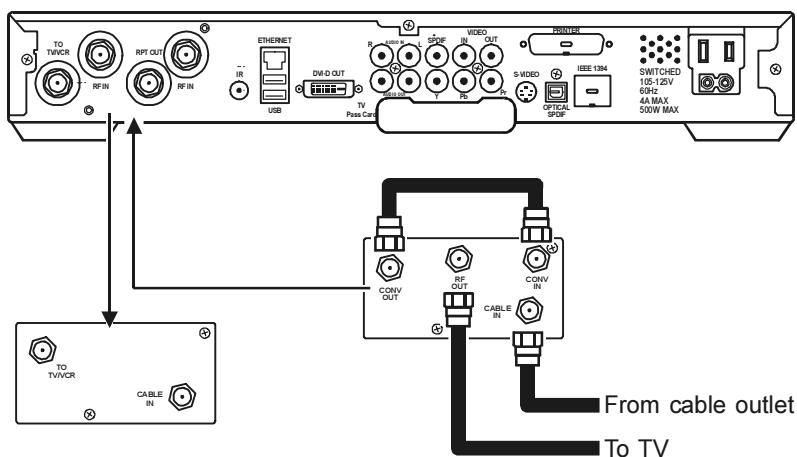
- For basic cable connections, use 75-ohm coaxial cables equipped with F-type connectors. A 6-foot coaxial cable is provided to connect the DCT5100 to your cable wall outlet. A 6-foot component video cable and left/right audio cables are provided to connect the DCT5100 to your TV.
- If you are connecting a coaxial cable from the TO TV/VCR connector on the DCT5100 to the coaxial CABLE/ANTENNA IN connector on the TV, you must tune your TV to channel 3 or 4 to view the DCT5100 output. *Connecting the DCT5100 in this manner will remove its high definition video capability.*
- Disconnect power from the DCT5100 before connecting or changing cable connections.
- **Do not** place anything on top of the DCT5100, especially other home entertainment components.

DCT5100s offer component video, an output that provides a higher level of picture quality. If your high definition television (HDTV) or home theater receiver has component video inputs, connect to the component video connections on your DCT5100 instead of the RCA or S-Video video connections. A component video cable is supplied with your DCT5100 for connecting component video. For more information, see the High Definition Television section.

The DCT5100 may be equipped with an optional RF Bypass switch.

When the optional RF bypass switch is activated, it routes the cable signal directly to a cable-ready TV, bypassing the DCT5100. This configuration enables you to view clear analog programming on the direct cable signal should the DCT5100 be powered off.

The RF bypass is not available on all cable systems.



BEFORE YOU BEGIN

Please take a few minutes to read through these pages before connecting your DCT5100 for the first time.

Your new DCT5100 brings a world of entertainment possibilities to your living room: high-quality video, surround-sound audio, on-demand programming and much more. However, before you can enjoy all your new services, the DCT5100 must be updated with the latest operating software, authorized by your local cable operator and customized for your HDTV. This section describes the simple steps required to download the necessary software, notify your cable company that your DCT5100 is ready to receive programming, and configure your DCT5100 to work with your HDTV.

Please connect the DCT5100 to your other home entertainment devices before proceeding with the steps below. See the connection diagrams under "Connecting Your DCT5100" for the appropriate connections for your home entertainment system.

Downloading Software

Once you have completed connecting your DCT5100 to your other home entertainment devices, plug the power cord supplied with your DCT5100 into the DCT5100 power inlet and your wall outlet. The software download will start automatically.

After a few moments **HUNT** will appear in the front panel LED, and then **Fr 1**. This indicates the DCT5100 is checking for a data channel with the information that allows it to synchronize with your cable operator's system and download software.

Until the data channel is identified, **HUNT**, **Fr 2**, **HUNT**, **Fr 3**, etc., up to **Fr 10**, may be displayed on the front panel LED.

Once the DCT5100 locates the channel, the letters **dL** and a spinning zero will appear in the front panel LED. This indicates the software download is underway.

The software download may take up to 45 minutes (or longer if your cable operator is experiencing high demand). As long as the progress indicator is spinning, the download is progressing.

Once the download is complete, **EF** will be displayed in the LED, and then **FP**. These displays may each last up to 60 seconds, after which the LED will go blank.

Proceed to the next step, Calling your Cable Operator for Authorization.

Calling Your Cable Operator for Authorization

- 1** Turn on your DCT5100 by pressing **POWER** on the front panel.
0 is displayed in the LED, indicating the software download was successful and your DCT5100 is ready to be authorized for service.
- 2** Obtain your DCT5100's serial number and unit address before calling your cable operator.
These numbers can be found on the peel-off label on the front of your DCT5100 as well as on the unit itself. The Serial Number consists of twelve characters beginning with *GI*. The Unit Address consists of 16 numbers preceded by *UA*.
- 3** Call your cable operator.
Your cable operator will record your billing information and authorize your DCT5100 to operate on their system. This process may take up to 30 minutes (or longer if your cable operator is experiencing high demand).

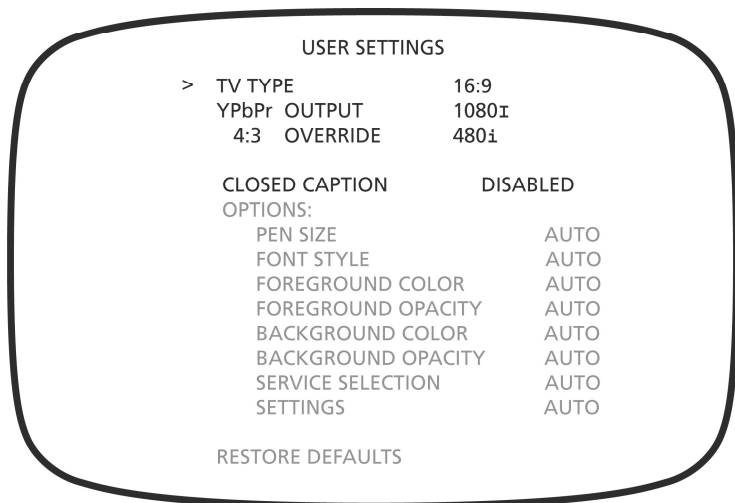

Configuring Your DCT5100 for HDTV

Please connect the DCT5100 to your other home entertainment devices and authorize the DCT5100 before proceeding with the steps below. See the connection diagrams under "Connecting Your DCT5100" for the appropriate connections for your home entertainment system. See "Authorizing your DCT5100" for authorization instructions.

You can use the on-screen display menu to configure your high definition settings for TV type, component video outputs, and close captioning.

To access your high definition settings, ensure that your DCT5100 is plugged into a power outlet and is turned off. Press the **MENU** key on the front panel. If your TV is on, the on-screen display menu appears listing the settings you can configure. The user settings will also be displayed on the front panel LED whether your TV is off or on.



If the on-screen display menu does not appear on your HDTV screen, your TV may not support the default standard definition setting (480i). Use the DCT5100 front panel LED to view and change your settings.

Use your remote control or the cursor keys on the front panel to navigate the on-screen display. Press the **▲** and **▼** keys to highlight the setting you wish to change. Press the **►** key to select an option for that setting. To exit the setting and move to another setting, use the **▲** and **▼** keys. To exit the menu and save your settings, press the **POWER** or **MENU** key.

The high definition settings are described in the table on the following pages.

User Options

Setting	Description
TV Type	Selects the type of TV. The LED panel will display the output type you have selected. Defaults to 16:9 WIDESCREEN. Options are 16:9 WIDESCREEN for wide screen TVs; 4:3 LETTERBOX or 4:3 PAN/SCAN (for normal TVs). <i>4:3 LETTERBOX fits High Definition programming onto your screen by placing black bars at the top and bottom of the screen. 4:3 PAN/SCAN fills the entire screen by cropping the left and right edges of enhanced definition widescreen programming.</i>
Y Pb Pr Output	Selects the video display format for the component video outputs. The LED panel will display the format you have selected. Defaults to 1080i. Options are 1080i, 720p, 480p, or 480i. Some TVs can only support certain display formats. Check your TV User Guide for more information. <i>If you are not using an HDTV, selecting a format other than 480i will cause the on-screen display to go blank. If this happens you can still view your settings on the LED panel to change the format back to 480i.</i>
4:3 Override	Selects the output format for 4:3 standard definition pictures. Defaults to 480i. Options are OFF, 480i or 480p. <i>If YPrPb Output is set to 480i, this setting cannot be changed.</i> This setting provides the ability to specify how 4:3 pictures are to be displayed on your TV. Most TV programming is 4:3 aspect ratio (square). Selecting OFF will display regular TV programs that are 4:3 aspect ratio in widescreen format. If you have a widescreen TV, black bars will be placed on the left and right of the picture to fit your screen. Selecting OFF when you have a 4:3 TV Type may result in a small picture and black bars around the picture. Selecting 480i will transmit TV programs that are not high definition in their original 480i format. Some TVs cannot display 480i format on their component video inputs (Y Pb Pr). Check your TV User Guide for more information. Selecting 480p will convert TV programs that are not high definition to a higher quality 480p format. Some TVs cannot display 480p format on their component video inputs (Y Pb Pr). Check your TV User Guide for more information.



Setting	Description
Closed Caption	Turns closed captions off or on. The LED panel will display the status of the closed captions. Defaults to DISABLED. Options are ENABLED or DISABLED.
Pen Size	Selects the font size for closed captions. Defaults to AUTO. Options are AUTO, STANDARD, LARGE, or SMALL.
Font Style	Selects the font style for closed captions. Defaults to AUTO. Options are AUTO, MONO SERIF, PROPORTION SERIF, MONO NO SERIF, PROPORTION NO SERIF, CASUAL, CURSIVE, or SMALL.
Fore-ground Color	Selects the foreground color for closed captions. Defaults to AUTO. Options are AUTO, WHITE, BLACK, RED, GREEN, BLUE, YELLOW, MAGENTA, or CYAN.
Fore-ground Opacity	Selects the opacity of the closed captions foreground. Defaults to AUTO. Options are AUTO, TRANSPARENT, TRANSLUCENT, SOLID, or FLASHING.
Back-ground Color	Selects the background color for closed captions. Defaults to AUTO. Options are AUTO, WHITE, BLACK, RED, GREEN, BLUE, YELLOW, MAGENTA, or CYAN.
Back-ground Opacity	Selects the background opacity for closed captions. Defaults to AUTO. Options are AUTO, TRANSPARENT, TRANSLUCENT, SOLID, or FLASHING.
Service Selection	Selects the service to be used for closed captions. Defaults to AUTO. Options are AUTO, PRIMARY LANGUAGE, SECONDARY LANGUAGE, 3, 4, 5, or 6.
Settings	Selects the default settings for closed captions (AUTO) or the settings you have configured (USER). Defaults to AUTO. Options are AUTO or USER.
Restore Defaults	Resets the on-screen display options to their default settings.

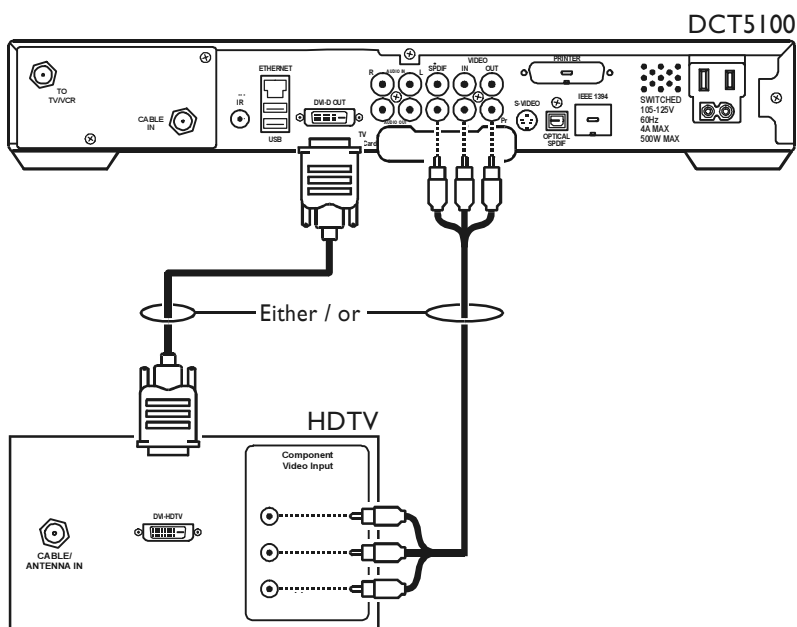
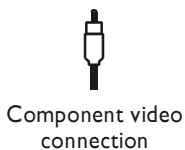

Connecting HDTV

- 1** Connect the RF coaxial cable supplied with the DCT5100 to the cable wall outlet and the CABLE IN connector on the DCT5100.
- 2** Connect the component video cables supplied with the DCT5100 to the Y, Pb, and Pr connectors on your HDTV and DCT5100.

Or

Connect a DVI cable to the DVI-D OUT connector on the DCT5100 and the DVI-HDTV connector on your TV.

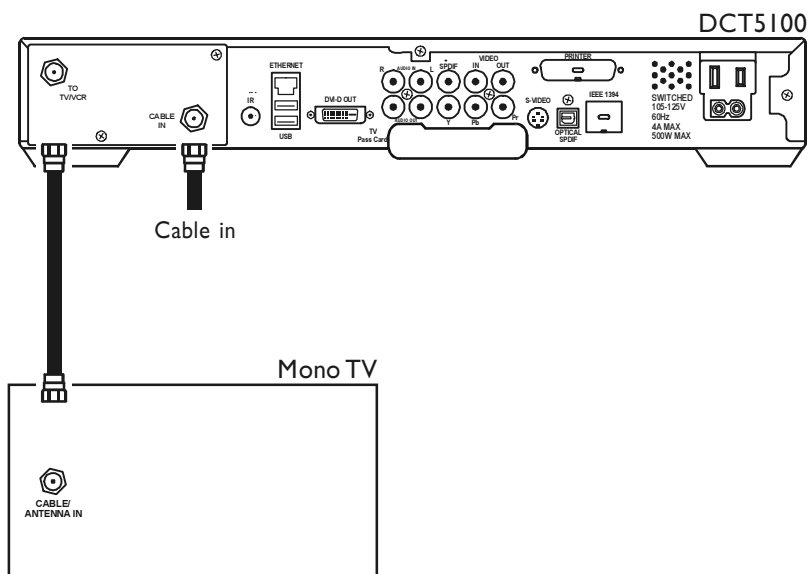
*These connections replace **only** the video connection between the DCT5100 and the TV described in the following sections. Continue to connect audio and video cables for other equipment as described in those sections.*

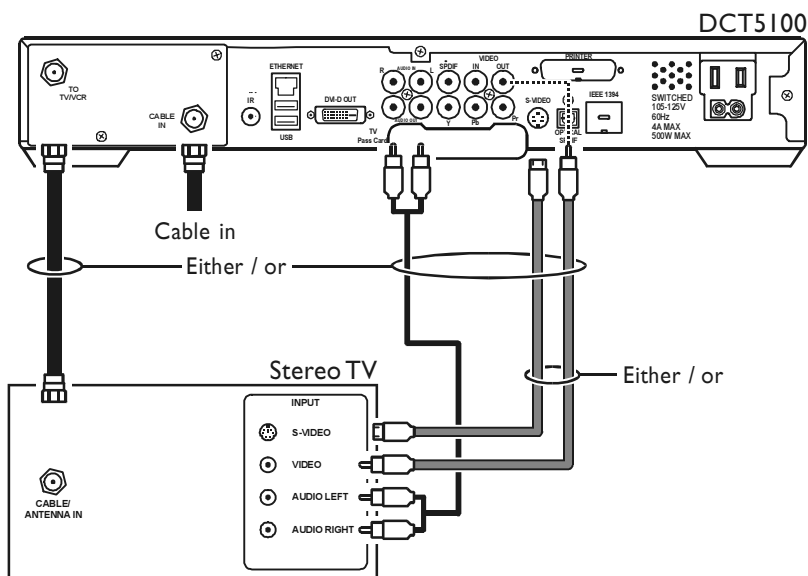

Connecting a Stereo TV

- 1** Connect the RF coaxial cable supplied with the DCT5100 to the cable wall outlet and the CABLE IN connector on the DCT5100.
- 2** Connect a second RF coaxial cable (not supplied) to the TO TV/VCR connector on the DCT5100 and the CABLE/ANTENNA IN connector on the TV.

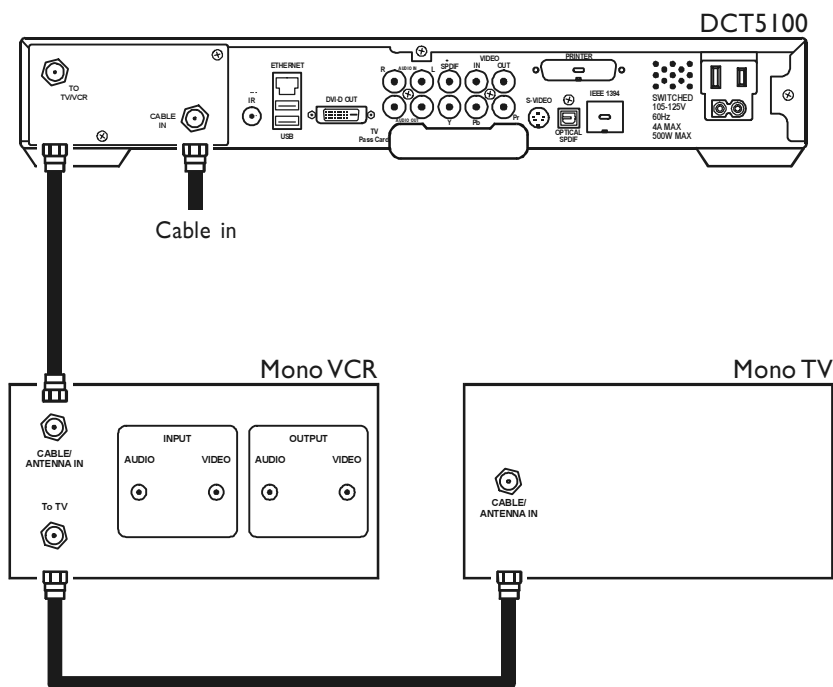
Connect the stereo audio cable supplied with the DCT5100 to the AUDIO R and L connectors on the DCT5100 and the AUDIO LEFT and AUDIO RIGHT connectors on the stereo TV. Connect a video cable to the VIDEO OUT connector on the DCT5100 and the INPUT VIDEO on the TV or an S-video cable to the S-VIDEO connectors on the DCT5100 and the TV.

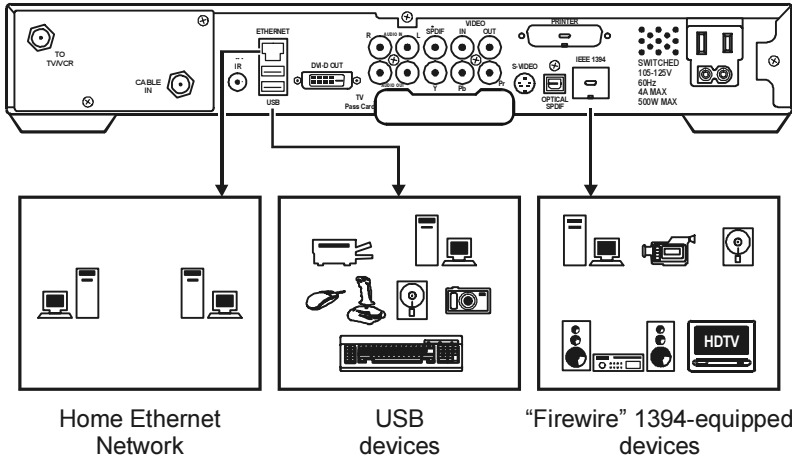
Use this diagram to record connections between your home entertainment components. Later, you can use this diagram to reconnect your system if you move the equipment or add new equipment.

DATA DEVICES



Do not attempt to connect data devices without contacting your service provider. Advanced data features require the proper application and network infrastructure to operate.

Data Features

In addition to high quality audio and video, the DCT5100 delivers high-speed data services such as Internet access, e-mail, IP Telephony, E-Commerce, and home banking. The integrated cable modem, USB and Ethernet ports will also allow you to network PCs, printers and digital audio/video devices.

Your DCT5100 may be equipped with the interface connections illustrated, but their functionality depends on the services offered by your service provider. Contact your service provider to determine the applications and functionality supported within your system.

TROUBLESHOOTING

Before calling your service provider, review this troubleshooting guide. This information is to help you quickly solve a problem. If your problem still exists, contact your service provider.

Problem	Possible Solution
No sound	Press MUTE on the remote control to restore the volume level. Check that the stereo is directed to the proper input source. Turn your VCR on.
No picture	Check to be sure that all cables are connected properly (hand-tighten if necessary). If connected through the baseband RCA video connection, make sure the cables are connected properly. If you are watching TV using your VCR, be sure your VCR is on. Check that the TV is directed to the proper input source.
Picture or sound is noisy on one channel	Reconnect the cable and hand-tighten if loose.
Sound from only one stereo speaker	Hand-tighten or reconnect the cables properly. Be sure wires are not frayed and plugs are not bent or broken.
No power	Reconnect the power cord. Be sure the DCT5100 is plugged into an outlet that is always live and not a switched outlet from another piece of equipment
Remote control does not work	Press CABLE on the remote control to ensure the remote control is in cable mode. Change the batteries in your remote control. Be sure that nothing is on the DCT5100 or blocking a clear line of sight to it and the remote control.
Poor audio quality	For best audio quality, use the remote control to set the DCT5100 to approximately 75% of maximum volume level and then adjust the audio levels on the external devices.
